CONCEPT BEHIND "IN SEARCH OF THE SKY KING"

The 30-minute documentary "In Search of the Sky King" will profile the travel of one Jon Sweetwood. Mr. Sweetwood is currently a University of Missouri-Columbia student and travel connoisseur. At age 18, he has been through 23 states and has traveling as his most pleasurable activity to engage in. He is an interesting and exciting traveler that looks at traveling with a different point-of-view. He doesn't see traveling as a destination, but rather a journey into the unknown to garner all the memorable moments that come his way.
